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THOMAS BUTLER

Dissolution of the monasteries

The forge stayed under the control of the monks at Kirkstall Abbey for nearly 400 years until the reign of Henry VIII and the dissolution of the monasteries in 1539. It was then given to Cranmer, Archbishop of Canterbury. Cranmer was later burnt at the stake and control of the Abbey and forge returned to the Crown in 1553 before being sold in 1584 to Sir Robert Saville. The Saville family remained in charge for over 80 years before passing to the Earl of Sussex, later to the Spencers, in the late 1600s before Sir John Watts, Richard Crookes took over in 1757.

Trading with America

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Whilst there are recorded purchases of iron in small quantities in 1744, 1753 and 1757, trade really began with America from Kirkstall Forge in 1794 following the War of Independence. Trade was hampered by slow communication and transport as the post left once a month for America. Despite these difficulties, by 1798 Kirkstall Forge was trading with 16 companies in Baltimore and Philadelphia.

Contributing to Leeds General Infirmary

Leeds General Infirmary was founded in 1767 and Thomas Butler, also known as Thomas the Diarist, recorded in his diary on 28 July 1797 that his father Thomas Butler (who originally took over the forge with George and Betty Beecroft) went to Leeds to attend the weekly board meeting at the Infirmary and donated 20 guineas, which is roughly £12,000 in today's money. Again, in December 1798 Thomas wrote that the workmen at Kirkstall Forge had contributed £3 in support of the Leeds General Infirmary (roughly £1,500 in today's money) and that their donation was received with thanks.

We continue to learn more about the history of Kirkstall Forge, and whilst we have covered more of the recent history in the previous newsletter, we wanted to take a look at the very beginnings of the Forge and the role it has played in local and national history. We continue to honour the roots of the forge as we move forward into the next chapter of its story.

Cistercian beginnings

In 1151 over 850 years ago a small group of Cistercian monks came to the settlement of Kirkstall on the wooded banks of the River Aire to lay the foundations of Kirkstall Abbey. The Cistercian monks would become the great industrial force of its age and Kirkstall, one of its most important abbeys. The completion of the Mill Race is estimated to have happened around 100 AD, the same time that Kirkstall Forge begun, as it provided the power needed to drive the water wheels operating the hammers to forge the iron. The water wheel and helve hammer ceased work in December 1918.



FORGING MORE FUTURES AT THE CAMPUS

You might remember from our Spring newsletter that CEG intends to launch their inaugural 2018 Professional Apprenticeship through the Forging Futures Campus this September. The apprenticeships are supported by our consultant partner teams involved in the Kirkstall Forge and Southbank Leeds regeneration schemes to provide 12 apprenticeships as part of our Forging Futures Campus, starting in September.

The apprenticeships will deliver opportunities in project management, cost management, building surveying, planning, infrastructure & civil engineering, structural engineering, mechanical and electrical engineering, architecture, landscape design, fire safety engineering, property management and commercial & residential agency.

We have received over 100 expressions of interest and continue to work with local schools, graduates of the Forging Futures Campus, referral partners and community groups to identify more potential candidates who are interested and would benefit from the scheme. Those who are not selected to go through the apprenticeship programme will be directed to one of the other pathways. These are available through the Forging Futures Campus and the extended network that CEG continues to promote through our Kirkstall Forge and Southbank Leeds.

- Scheme starts in September and runs for 2 years
- Each pupil gets a rotation experiencing a project from a number of different disciplines
- Part of a paid apprenticeship
- Leading to a Level 2 HNC qualification with most of the content being Level 3

Our next Employability Skills course will be a 3 week course

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INCREASED SERVICES AT KIRKSTALL FORGE

From 20 May 2018 the new train timetable has brought significant change to the frequency of trains to and from Kirkstall Forge. Kirkstall Forge station has proved hugely popular and surpassed its forecast annual passenger numbers within five months of opening in 2016. Although around 20,200 journeys to Leeds were forecast for the station's first year of operation, 21,400 were recorded in just the first five months.

Northern Rail introduced five additional peak-hour stops at the station in December 2017. In May 2018 they introduced more frequent services between Leeds and Bradford via Kirkstall Forge, which means that a half hourly service runs throughout the day and journey times between Leeds and Kirkstall Forge are just 6 minutes.

The half-hourly service is welcome news, not only for the 15,000 people who live nearby, but also the 10,000 people who will live, work and enjoy the site over the next decade.
